AMA has spent about \$418,903 so far this year and about \$290,000 will be coming back to the school in reimbursements on a quarterly basis. We need approval on Q3 and Q4.

Ena LaVan LCAP presentation:

LCAP (Local Control Accountability Plan) – Addresses the needs of specific niche communities to provide a higher level of funding. The LCAP involves a lot of different stakeholders including parents, educators, local government etc ...

It is important that we engage stakeholders so the local community is engaged in a plan to help the school move forward.

LCFF (Local Control Funding Formula) – Provides specific funding and guidelines on how the funding should be used.

The LCAP needs to be approved by the board and then we must submit our LCAP to AMA's authorizer Los Angeles Unified School District.

School Site Council – Is a peer council that must approve all school funding and make sure we meet their requirements. The council must be voted in by their specific group of peers i.e. teachers vote for teachers. SSC Peer Elections will take place on 9/13/2019 and we will have the results on 9/16/2019.

The LCAP is very detailed and must include goals, expected measurable outcomes (metrics) actions and services. It must also include details on the specific programs provided to AMA's students and at what level. The local indicators include implementation of academic standards, stakeholder engagement plan, local climate survey, access to broad course of study and a detailed Calendar.

It is important that data is being sent to that board on a regular basis so that everyone is very well versed in what is going on with the school academically.

CEO Report -

As we track the success of the meal program with Fresh Start goes, we will make adjustments. During our last special Board Meeting, we approved the contract with Fresh Start. John White agreed that it was standard food vendor agreement.

Enrollment

We had a strong start with pre-enrollment but many potential families became discouraged by AMA not having a building until so late in the year. However, our goal is still to increase enrollment by "Norm" day. The AMA team is doing outreach daily to make sure that we are successful.

Innovation X Series

The school year is off to a great start. Our scholars have been extremely receptive and happy to be here. We have also been focused on our industry partnerships within our pathways. We created the AMA Innovation X series which features conversations with industry leaders from companies such as The Mills, The Boeing Company, RCH Studios etc.

Future Recruitment

We have already started the recruitment process for next year and have a healthy lead list of 8th graders. Additionally, we have been working with 25 Feeder Schools at the middle school level and plan to increase our relationships with more schools this year.
